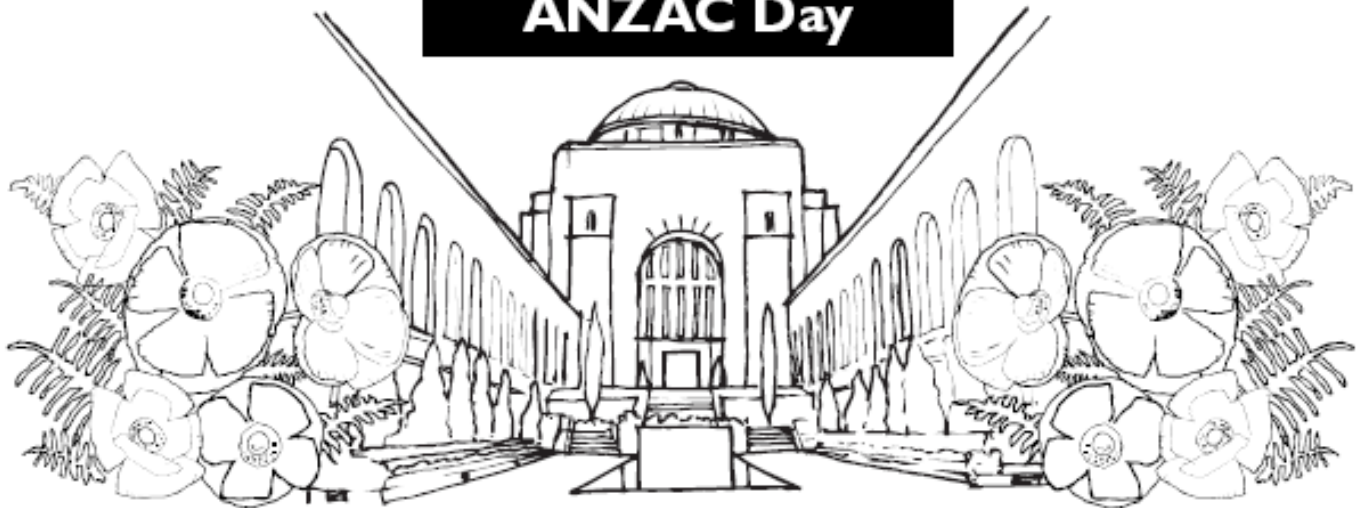


ANZAC Day



ANZAC Day, held on 25 April, marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.

ANZAC is an acronym for Australian New Zealand Army Corp.

Red poppies are symbolic of ANZAC day as it was the poppy that appeared as the first living plant that sprouted from the battlefields of the war.

Make a poppy

You will need:

- Red and black crepe paper
- Pipe cleaner
- Scissors
- Glue

Here's how:

1. Cut out the poppy template.
2. Place over the red crepe paper and cut around it.
3. Take the pipe cleaner and bend over the top at 1 cm length.
4. Repeat the 1 cm bend.
5. Push the straight end of the pipe cleaner through the crepe poppy, pushing it all the way to the bend.
6. Cut a piece of black paper and paste onto the centre of the poppy.
