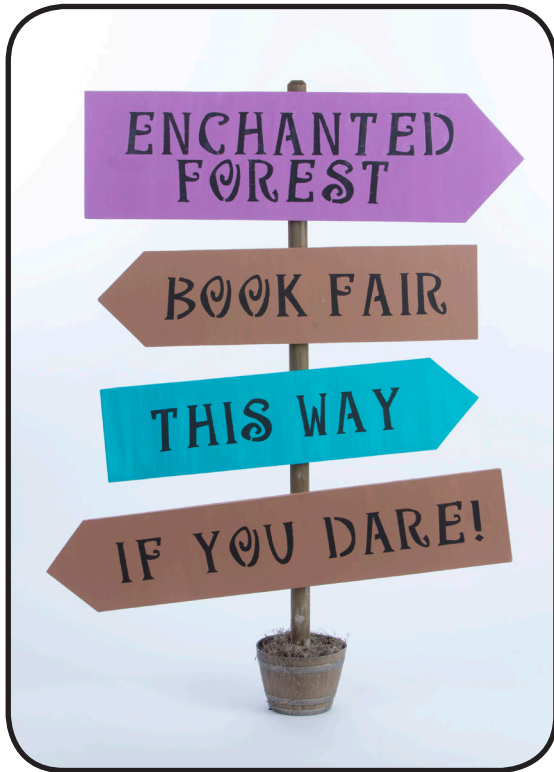


Book Fair Directional Sign



Supplies*:

- Wood post
- Hand saw
- Bucket
- Quick dry cement
- Dry moss
- Letter stencil
- Foam insulation board
- Utility knife
- Meter stick
- Paint brushes
- Purple, brown, blue, and black paint
- Letter stencil
- Stencil paint brush
- Duct tape or hot glue gun

Directions:

1. Cut a wood post to 5'- 6' tall. Put one end into the bucket and secure in place with quick dry cement mix. Stabilize the wood post so it stands up straight while drying in place overnight.
2. Cover the cement with dry moss.
3. Lay out your letter stencils, spelling out the words on the signs, to determine the length of each directional arrow.
4. Cut out the four directional arrows from foam insulation board with a meter stick and utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
5. Paint all the arrows a base color. Allow to dry.
6. Paint the words onto the directional signs using the letter stencil, stencil paint brush, and black paint. Allow to dry.
7. Attach the completed directional signs to the wood post, in the order shown, with duct tape or hot glue.

*Remember, these are only suggestions. This project should be fun and creative, so use supplies you have on hand for substitutions.
