

Toadstool Décor



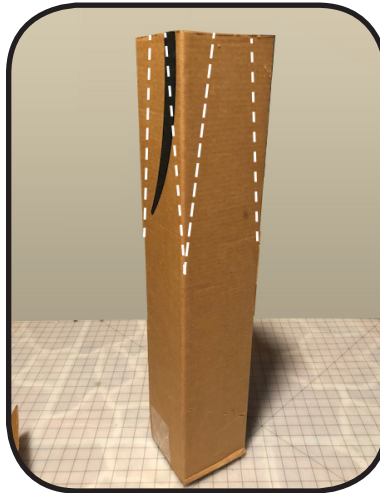
Supplies*:

- 4' paper roll boxes
- Utility knife
- Tan masking tape
- Green and brown paint
- Paint brushes
- 38" x 50' temporary floor cardboard roll
- Scissors
- Meter stick
- Hot glue gun

Directions:



1. Cut an 18" section out of the paper roll box with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*



2. Cut off the edges at angles at the top of the box, like shown.
3. Fold the sides in until the edges are touching. Tape together so that the box tapers like the stem of a toadstool.



4. Open the bottom of the box and unfold the flaps, creating a steady base.
5. Paint the flaps green and the stem brown.

6. Loosely cut a large wavy circle out of the cardboard roll.
7. Cut a straight line from the edge of the circle to its center point.
8. Tuck one side of the cut under the other and slide it underneath until the circle becomes a cone, forming the shape of a toadstool. Hot glue the cardboard together, securing its shape.
9. Dry brush a small amount of brown paint to the toadstool head. Allow to dry.
10. Hot glue the toadstool head to the stem.

*Remember, these are only suggestions.
This project should be fun and creative, so use
supplies you have on hand for substitutions.
